## "The Rover"



The BlueSkillet Rovers have added a funky/sizzling new feature to their show! Meet "The Rover".

The Blues stage on wheels... a mini music museum, complete with instruments and outfits to enhance audience participation. A roof over our heads, (and instruments), for those, wet, or hot, outdoor festival moments.

The Rover functions as a small venue and is available for use by other acts (by negotiation). Production, including a small PA and LED lighting can be supplied if required. Ideally, a 3 x 1.5 metre low-level stage riser will be supplied by the festival/venue (see photos).

#### **Dimensions**

With the new, self-supported awning, the required area is approximately 5 x 3.6 metres. With the traditional awning, the Rover requires a square area of approximately  $6.5 \times 6.5$  metres. Please see attached diagrams for detail.

#### Power

The Rover requires access to a single 10 amp, 240 volt power supply. A circuit breaker has been installed in accordance with festival requirements.

We provide our own tagged / certified extension leads and surge-protected powerboards for powering lighting, sound equipment and fans for air circulation, necessary for instrument and patron care.

#### Insurance

We are insured for Public Liability and Equipment Theft or Damage through MARSH Musical Solutions. Certification is available if required.

## Set-up

We are responsible for all aspects of set-up, maintenance and pack-down throughout the event. We require event access for two additional people (non-band members) to assist with this process and ensure that there is always someone on-site to liaise with artists, audience and festival staff while the Royer is in use.

#### OH&S


We are very concious of patron and performer safety and are continuously improving our safety procedures. The space and storage have been designed with safety in mind.

We engage in the following processes to address OH & S issues:

- · wheel chocks
- towball padded and clearly marked
- levelling and stabilising the van chassis
- clearly marking pegs, levels, entrances, equipment, stairs etc.
- all openings can be locked securely
- all cabling is covered or secured safely
- lighting for both ambience and safety, including strip lights on awning ropes etc.
- all-weather consideration includes insulation and thermo-sheild paint and fans for air circulation in hot weather
- first aid kit and at least one person with current first aid certificate on site
- fire extinguisher and blanket
- mobile phones on site with key phone numbers programmed into contacts
- a small fridge is provided for ice packs and rehydration fluid (water, electrolyte drinks etc.)
- the space is kept tidy, free from obstructions, trip hazards, spills etc.




### Smaller, self-supported awning
